

EMTALA

HISTORY & APPLICATION



History

- In 1986 Congress passed EMTALA to eliminate the practice of "patient dumping," i.e., refusal to treat people because of an inability to pay or insufficient insurance coverage.
- It also made it unlawful to transfer or discharge emergency patients based on anticipated high diagnostic and treatment costs.
- EMTALA also outlines how hospitals treat persons presenting with a possible or perceived medical emergency and/or who may be in active labor.




Application

- Per the Center for Medicaid/Medicare Services (CMS) any hospital with a dedicated Emergency Department (ED) must comply
- Physicians: emergency, treating or on-call
 - Advanced practice providers (Nurse Practitioners or Physician Assistants) can provide a medical screening provided it is within the scope of services
- At TONHC EMTALA only applies to the Sells Hospital campus
- EMTALA is not covered under the Federal Torts Claim Act







EMTALA

REQUIREMENTS



Hospital Obligations

- Medical Screening Exam (MSE) by a qualified Provider to determine if an Emergency Medical Condition (EMC) truly exists
- Stabilizing treatment
- Appropriate transfer
- Record keeping
- Emergency Room (ER) Log
- Policy
- EMTALA still applies to LTAC (Long Term Acute Care) dispositions
- If no EMC exists, no EMTALA obligation






Notice to Patients

- EMTALA Notice
 must be posted in
 the front of each
 hospital entrance
- Notice must indicate whether the hospital participates in the State Medicaid program (AHCCCS)








EMTALA

PROCESS



Procedure


- Stabilizing treatment under an EMTALA obligation continues until the EMC is resolved, transferred or admitted
- Treatment within the Hospital's capabilities
- Care provided by qualified medical personnel
- Informed refusal of consent to treatment
 - Must explain the consequences and risks involved
- Document any such refusal on the Refusal Of Treatment Form





Transfer & Record Keeping

- Unstable transfer:
 - MD must certify benefit to transfer outweighs risk to transfer
 - Pt. May make written request only after being informed of obligations under EMTALA and risks of transfer
- Physician certification
- Must be appropriate
- Duty to accept from receiving facility
- Duty to report EMTALA violations
- Whistleblower protections
- ER log, On-call / Duty Physician list





Penalties

May be subject to termination of its Medicare provider agreement (exclusion from Medicare participation)

- Civil monetary penalties:
 - A participating hospital that is found to negligently violate a requirement of EMTALA is subject to a civil monetary penalty of up to \$50,000 for each violation of the statute
 - A physician who is responsible for the examination, treatment, or transfer of a patient and who negligently violates a requirement of EMTALA is subject to a civil monetary penalty of up to \$50,000 for each violation of the statute

Agreement Checklist

- **M** EMTALA is EVERYONE's responsibility!

Anyone crossing the cattle guard at the main gate at Sells Hospital for any reason is on hospital property. If care is needed, a medical screening exam is promised and carried out.

- As A TONHC Employee, abide by all laws
- ☑ Understand that any person will be directed/taken to the ED if they:
 - State, suspect, or appear to be having a medical emergency
 - Think they are in active labor
 - Are found unconscious/unresponsive or otherwise incapacitated
- ☑ NO ONE SHALL BE TURNED AWAY \$50,000.00 fine
