Public Service Announcement

The **Division of Behavioral Health** continues to serve the nations members with modified protocols. During the COVID-19 pandemic we have seen an alarming increase in mental health crisis's, domestic violence reports, and substance abuse. Mental health care is considered an essential service, and our staff have been providing members services throughout this pandemic and will continue.

Our **Domestic Violence- Komchud Ki** program is answering their 24-hour crisis hotline and responding to members in need of services.

Behavioral Health Staff is also responding to crisis calls and notifications. Members in crisis may call our Sells main number during normal business hours Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm and a counselor will call them back promptly. Members may also call the dedicated tribal crisis line at any time and crisis mobile teams will to all areas of the nation. Members may schedule regular appointments for **counseling or psychiatry** by calling our Sells main number. Behavioral Health is helping members be placed into **residential treatment** when needed.

Telehealth appointments are being encouraged, however, members who need to be seen face-to-face, may make a face-to-face appointment. Our offices are not currently open to the public for walk-in appointments, however, appointments may be scheduled ahead of time. If you are coming to the office for a face-to-face appointment, you will be screened and provided a face-mask if you do not have one, prior to entering the building. If you have symptoms of COVID-19 and are in crisis, please inform our staff or the crisis professionals at that time so they may respond appropriately.

Substance abuse treatment- IOPT, Substance abuse, and aftercare groups are being offered through Telehealth conferencing only. If you need to participate in group treatment, please call our main number for more information.

Anger Management and Domestic Violence groups are not currently being offered, we will expand telehealth groups as our capacity to provide telehealth services improves, and will inform the public when additional groups will be offered online.
