COVID-19 Vaccination Continues on the Tohono O'odham Nation All Elders 75 years and older All Frontline Essential Workers on the TO Nation Tribal Members who are Frontline Essential Workers off the TO Nation

IMPORTANT UPDATE: The TONHC Vaccine Scheduling HELP Line is currently experiencing a very high volume of calls and is overwhelmed. It may be difficult to obtain phone assistance to schedule an appointment, we therefore encourage people who meet the criteria below to **WALK IN before 2pm**. Arriving prior to 2pm will allow the TONHC Staff members time to register you onsite.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: ALL persons who wish to receive the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at Tohono O'odham Nation Health Care **MUST have an active medical chart in our electronic health record system**. If you are not currently a patient at TONHC or believe that you do not have an active medical chart with TONHC, you **MUST** call to pre-register by phone prior to coming in to be vaccinated. This applies to tribal members who are beneficiaries, as well as persons who are not tribal members.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: COVID-19 Vaccination is now available at TONHC to members of the Tohono O'odham Nation and other tribes **in the Phase 1A and Phase 1B eligible groups listed below**. TONHC will also offer vaccination to persons who are not tribal members who either work or live on the Tohono O'odham Nation, **AND fall into one of the eligible groups**

- Persons aged 75 years and older.
- Frontline essential workers who live or work on the Tohono O'odham Nation (tribal members and non-tribal members included)
- Frontline essential workers who live or work outside of the Tohono O'odham Nation AND who are registered as a member of a tribe AND who receive regular medical care at TONHC
- Healthcare professionals, medicine men and women, First Responders, Police, Fire
- Government workers: District Leaders, Legislative, Executive, and Judicial Branches
- Health Transportation
- Information Technology/Cyber Security
- Utility workers: ex: TOUA, Water/wastewater, Waste removal services
