## COVID-19 at-home tests kits available FREE by mail

Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order 4 free at-home COVID-19 Rapid Antigen tests. The tests are completely free. Orders will usually ship in 7-12 days.

## When to use your at-home COVID-19 Rapid Antigen test:

- If you begin having COVID-19 symptoms: fever, sore throat, runny nose, or loss of taste or smell, or
- At least 5 days after you come into close contact with someone with COVID-19, or
- Before going to gather with a group of people, especially those who are at risk of severe disease or may not be up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines.

### What to do if you are sick:

If you develop cough, fever, sore throat, difficulty breathing or loss of smell or taste, or diarrhea:

- Isolate (stay apart from others) for a minimum of 5 days or until your fever resolves.
- Test any day after your symptoms started.
- Wear a well-fitting mask for a total of 10 days, even if you test negative.
- If you test positive, you do not need a "confirmation" test in clinic.
- Public Health does not recommend re-testing for 3 months after a positive test.
- Seek care for any serious symptoms or if you have underlying health conditions.

Notify your health clinic or public health team if anyone in your household tests positive.
